## Tips for group Entries

### Preparation

- Visit the Children's Week WA [Website](#) to find out more about the Project
- Turn the project into a lesson! Visit the school library and analyse different styles used by Author/ Illustrators or open a thoughtful dialogue about the [UN Conventions on the Rights of the Child](#)
- Watch our [tips and tricks video](#) from our Author and Illustrator, Briony Stewart, for some great storytelling hints!
- Download the appropriate [Story Pack](#) for your classes region and age group (choose the age group that the majority of the class will be turning in 2020)
- Prepare your entries in advance. We recommend finalising group entries at least one week out from the closure of the project to allow for any issues which may cause delays

### Submission:

- Take two photos (story and illustration) of each of the students work. Make sure to label the story and picture entry with each child's name
- Complete the [Entry Form](#) on the website, ensuring all details for your school are correct
- Upload multiple submissions at once by completing the form and then selecting the box "Add another child" - you may need to do this several times dependant on file size
- Contact [wa@childrensweek.org.au](mailto:wa@childrensweek.org.au) if you have any technical difficulties
- Request a free copy of the book for your school or library by emailing your request to: [wa@childrensweek.org.au](mailto:wa@childrensweek.org.au)

### Completion:

- Display finished artworks in classroom or library
- Join [Facebook Live](#) on Wednesday, 28th October 2020 from 10am to see if your students have been featured in the books!
- Wait for your copy of the book to arrive - read together with the class!
